LAS VERDES POA BOARD MEETING MINUTES

February 21, 2023

The meeting was called to order by President Tom Massey at 7:02 p.m. and we opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: There were 15 associations present: Aspen, Banyan, Bottlebrush (2), Copperleaf, Cypress, Dogwood, Evergreen, Forsythia, Laurel Oak (2), Oleander, Oliveleaf, Palmetto, Philodendron, Seagrape, and Viburnum. Two absent. There was a quorum.

Approval of Minutes: There was a motion by Jack Walsh to waive the reading of the last minutes, seconded by Fred Jurnove, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Diane Andruski read the report as of 1/31/2023.

Total Operating Cash: \$1,361,759.99 Total Reserves: \$1,008,269.80

Total Operating and Reserve Funds: \$2,370,029.79

President Massey reported that our accountant Karen Lippman suggested we invest some of our money into CDs since the interest rate is significantly more favorable than regular savings account interest. We will put about \$700,000 into 12-month CDs in the next week or two.

There were no questions. A motion was made by Jim Fogarty to accept the Treasurer's Report as read, seconded by Jack Walsh, motion passed.

President's Report:

CAR BREAK-INS – President Massey reported that there has been a series of break-ins into unlocked cars, with items being stolen. We had one car stolen, but the doors were unlocked, and the key was left in the car. Please remember to always lock your cars and do not leave valuables in there. In one unlocked car here, a gun and two magazines were taken by this perpetrator. Call 911 if you see anything suspicious. Please make a police report if you have been a victim. Villa owners can help by keeping your porch lights on all night.

SECURITY CAMERAS – The remaining four condo parking lot cameras have been ordered and will be installed soon. This completes this project.

TRASH- President Massey reported that we have a problem of empty bottles and other trash being thrown into the center lake. Please remember and remind your guests to pick up after themselves.

POOLS- It is per the Florida State Health Department that no food or glass is allowed in the pool areas. No eating or drinking at the pools. Plastic water bottles are permitted. Please discard your trash in the garbage cans that are located at the pools.

The was a motion to accept the President's Report by Nat DeVardo, seconded by Harvey Schwartz, motion passed.

Old Business:

BATHROOM RENOVATIONS- President Massey reported that all the materials for the Clubhouse bathroom renovations have been delivered. Since there are several events in March, including Bingo throughout the month, construction will begin April 1.

CANALS- We have contracted with a vendor who has a "spider" machine, which "walks" down the canals to help clean them out better. We have a few canals left to dig out and clean up, and that project will begin soon.

PIPES- The last big pipe that goes under the Clubhouse parking lot into the center lake will be relined next. This pipe is important to get completed, as we risk collapse of the road and parking lot if not addressed. The relining is supposed to last ninety years. The remaining pipes are much smaller and in grassy areas, and we will address replacing them after this final big pipe project is completed.

A motion was made by Jim Fogarty to accept the Old Business Report, seconded by Nat DeVardo. Passed.

New Business:

FINING COMMITTEE- We need one more person on the committee. We have a dog owner here who refuses to pick up after her dog. We have her on camera and video and she has been asked hundreds of times to pick up after the dog. She also is required by law to have the dog on a five-foot leash but uses a 20-foot leash. She received a letter in 2020 asking for compliance, which she has refused. The next step per Florida law is to fine the violator. A fine can be issued at \$100 per violation and the maximum fine can be \$1,000.00. Since she has had hundreds of violations, President Tom Massey called for a vote, by a raise of hands, as to whether to fine Adele and Lorenzo Antonino \$1,000.00. The vote passed unanimously. The next step if this doesn't bring compliance, is to have the dog removed as a nuisance.

There was some discussion about other violators and process to report. Please take pictures or videos

any of you know Tom Massey, our POA President, and may know he has two brothers that own villas here as well: Wally and Bill. How

did three brothers end up all buying properties here in Las Verdes?

Bill and Carol were all ready to purchase too, but sadly Bill got very sick with pancreatic cancer, so had to put off this dream. After he recovered, he and Carol found another villa in Philodendron that they were able to purchase in 2012.

All three brothers were snowbirds initially, and Tom made the move to be here full time about five years ago. Wally and Linda are here about six months, and up north the other six months and this is Bill and

Carol's first season spending significant time here as Carol recently retired. The brothers and their families get along well and enjoy hanging out with each other.

Delray Beach has really developed since the brothers started coming down here. The Avenue has been built up dramatically, as Delray used to be a rather "sleepy"

little town. All three brothers enjoy eating out, and some of their favorites include: Nino's, Papa Guiseppi's, Nana Noodles, Lindburger's, The Bird's Nest, Chaivo Thai, Jack's Pizza, Hacienda, and Brighton Bagels at Night for seafood. They like Sandee's for breakfast over on Federal Highway as well as Poppie's across the street. They enjoy golfing and golf two days a week. Carol enjoys the water class, and when Rose Redmond was alive the Worcester girls would take the Monday class together, and on

Wednesdays and Fridays, Rose would unofficially lead the class for all.

The Massey brothers enjoy having family and friends visit, with many lifelong friendships continuing. Las Verdes is so conveniently located to golf courses, great restaurants, shopping, and other fun things to do. They recommend the Water Taxi in Ft. Lauderdale if you have guests or want to have a fun day. Ft. Lauderdale is the "Venice of the US," and the water taxi makes about 14 different stops. You buy a pass for \$20.00 and can hop on and off all day sightseeing, shopping, dining, and enjoying time out on the water. It is an awesome day for out-of-towners.

Las Verdes continues to improve in appearance and in growing friendships. It is quite an active community now, with many people walking around the circle, day and night, and a lot of people playing pickleball. The POA events are attracting more and more people and Tom, as President, is happy to see people becoming more involved and getting to know their neighbors better.

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

Joe Downey moved to adjourn the meeting; seconded by Dimitra Tebano, motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 7:36 p.m.
